## History

- Co-Curricular programs
  - DVM+ programs (usually + MS)
  - Mostly informal as most students took the traditional route of doing one program at a time.
  - Late 1990s-early 2000s = emergence of formal programming
    - Practice areas demanded it
    - Students with broader career plans demanded it



## History

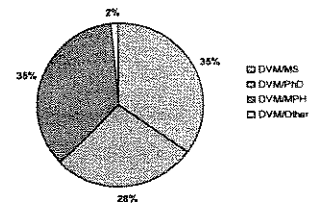
- Certificate and Continuing Education Programming
  - Colleges are responding to market forces
    - Professionals need training and resources to keep pace with practice changes
  - Students want unique training and certification that may not be as time consuming as additional degree.

- 263 students in co-curricular programs in US Colleges

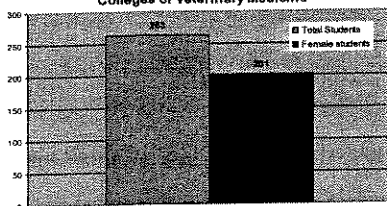
Breakdown of Co-Curricular Students in US Colleges of Veterinary Medicine

- 76% of co-curricular students are women

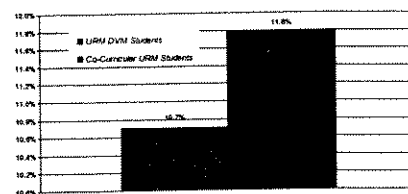
Women in Co-Curricular Programs at the US Colleges of Veterinary Medicine
